Be an inclusive body that promotes equality and diversity and reaches out to all communities in H&F

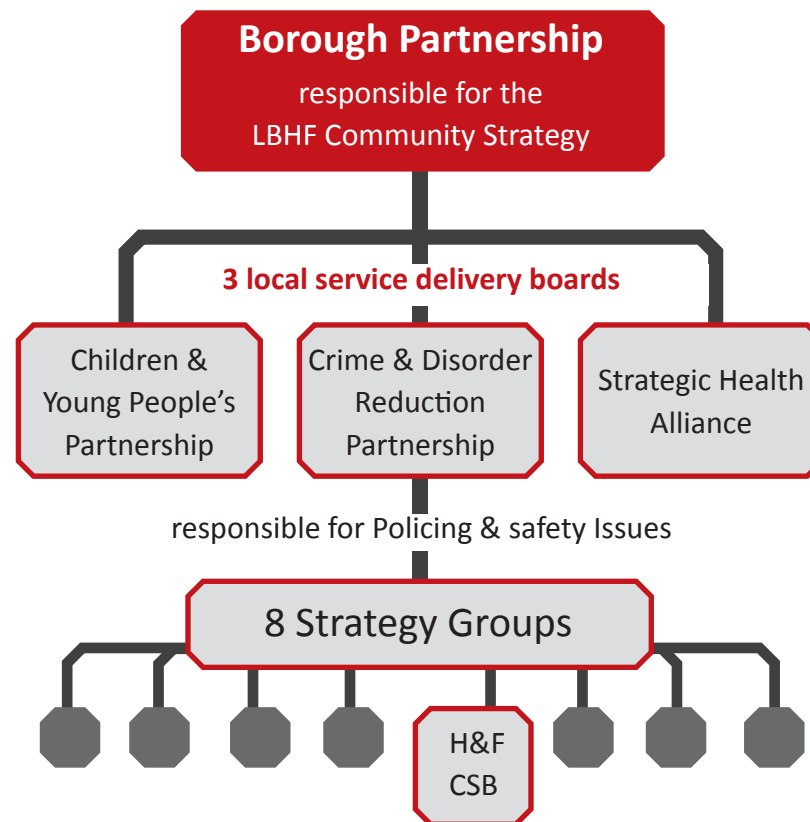


Provide opportunities for scrutiny of policing in the borough, as well as communication between communities and partners on the H&F CDRP

H&F CSB Membership

Membership of the Board is made up of 40 community organisations including Safer Neighbourhood Panels, voluntary and community sector organisations, business representative bodies and other interested groups.

Each organisation will nominate a representative to serve on the Board for one year.

16 places on the Board will be reserved for representatives from Safer Neighbourhood Panels (SNPs).

The CSB Membership will elect 8 Executive Committee members, including the Chair. 2 places on the Executive Committee are reserved for representatives from the Safer Neighbourhood Panels

Strengthen our partnerships within the Borough and across London

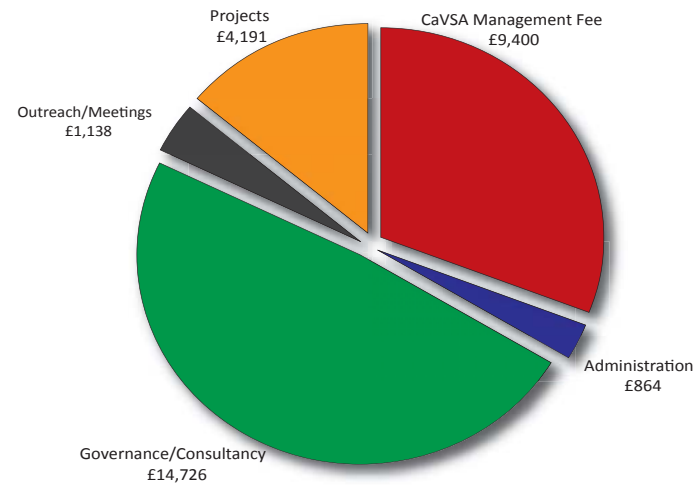

2007/2008 - how our money was spent

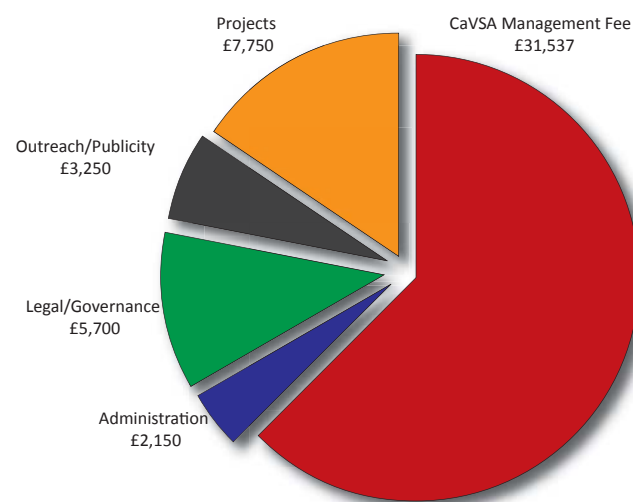
2007/2008 Income & Expenditure
